

- Candles, Cuisine & Caves in Ha Long Bay. Enjoy a welcome filled with Japanese hospitality, as guests enter through verdant gardens, art-adorned halls and stunning woodwork. Sample an array of sushi and

Guests taste the region's renowned vintages at the historic Church Road winery with a delicious lunch on your second day before taking in Napier's wonderful spin on art deco architecture.
